LDCF/SCCF: opportunities to advance NAPs

- (i) Projects under early stages of implementation or different stages of preparation – could these projects contribute towards the NAP process?
- (ii) Project and program concepts for NAPA implementation – do these present opportunities for advancing the NAP process?
- (iii) Addressing priority needs through projects and programs dedicated to the preparation of the NAP process – flexibility to with regard to scope, focus and duration

Modalities

- Full-sized projects: >\$2M, two-step process
- Medium-sized projects: <\$2M, one-step of twostep process
- Programmatic approach: coherent program of projects that contribute towards a shared objective across a common system or theme, new simplified approval process
- Project preparation grants: linked to projects and programs, no separate application process

Strategic alignment

- At the national level: NAPAs, National Communications; other relevant strategies, plans, policies, reports, assessments and frameworks; measures to advance the NAP process
- Endorsement by the GEF Operational Focal Point: required for all national and regional projects and programs, for the total LDCF/SCCF amount sought; OFP works in consultation with other stakeholders
- Alignment with GEF Programming Strategy on CCA and results framework

Baselines

- What would happen in absence of the proposed LDCF/SCCF grant?
 - baseline situation and problem (socioeconomic, environmental, current and expected CC impacts, etc.);
 - investments, projects, programs, plans and frameworks that address the baseline situation and associated problems;
 - climate change-related vulnerabilities that would not be adequately addressed under the baseline scenario
- Financing associated with baseline investments

Additional reasoning

- The LDCF/SCCF addresses the additional cost of adaptation – i.e. the cost of measures to reduce the vulnerabilities identified in the baseline scenario.
- Where possible, LDCF/SCCF funds are integrated into baseline interventions -- fosters greater impact and cost-effectiveness through synergies and economies of scale.
- The additional measures financed should translate into measurable adaptation benefits in line with the results framework of GEF Adaptation Program.
