Uganda has the highest refugee population in Africa, with over 1.7 million refugees mainly from South Sudan and the DRC (<u>UNHCR, 2024</u>). The Moyo District Farmers Association, with almost 30 years of respected grassroots presence in the Moyo district, has introduced an innovative solution focused on an inclusive climate adaptation planning process to integrate host-communities and refugees. This initiative targets local farmers to strengthen their knowledge, skills and tools to farm more sustainably and improve their income. Through the initiative, farmers are developing skills in agroforestry and climate-smart practices to restore natural resources, reduce vulnerability to food insecurity and economic shocks, and promote peaceful coexistence.



Key achievements

- 1,053 farmers (64% women) practising nature-based climate adaptation
- Conservation implemented on 250 acres
- Developed climate adaptation app for enhanced skill communication
- Trained 142 individuals in apiculture, beekeeping and coffee production
- Created accounts for two NGOs on the app and entered data for 893 farmers, 63% of whom are women



Adaptation benefits

- Increased resilience to extreme weather

Funding snapshot

Revenue per year	Total revenue \$35,000 per year, breakdown: \$22,000 tractor hire services \$8,300 produce sales \$2,000 membership fee \$2,700 office rent
Sustaining criteria	Membership fees, and income from tractor hire services and sunflower oil pressing machines
Financial innovation	The formation of the member- owned and operated Savings and Credit Cooperative Organization (SACCO) mobilized \$8,051 in savings from its 135 members, and the circular funding has disbursed \$1,589 in loans to date.
Expected return	15% from SACCO operation and 10% from the tractor hire services
