# **SUSTAINABILITY**

- MDFA will continue to strengthen extension and advisory services to the members through internal revenues (i.e. membership and subscription fee, income from tractor hire services and commissions from produce sales) even after the project period
- MDFA will continue to use climate Agri solutions app (developed) for extension services as well as monitoring and evaluation tool. The cost of hosting and other associated cost will be catered for by MDFA from internally generated revenues.
- Fostering and managing strategic collaboration and partnerships with local government and other partners

# **AREAS OF SCALE-UP**

- Enhancing the potential of carbon sinks (Wetlands, woodlands, bushlands, forests and tress etc) by increased restoration and conservation efforts supported by internal revenues and other strategic collaborations.
- Building and strengthening the capacity of more local community members in climate adaptation and mitigation approaches through scaling up of climate proofing trainings.
- We shall encourage our commercial farmers to invest in small-scale irrigation for increased climate resilience and income.
