Background/Context: 100 - 200 words Max (Please provide a brief background about your session topic, e.g. what is the current context/status of the topic issue, why is the topic relevant, etc.)	The Adaptation Innovation Marketplace's (AIM) is a platform developed in partnership between the UNDP, ICCCAD, the Adaptation Fund AF), the European Union (EU), GEF, GRP and Climate-KIC, designed to accelerate innovative technologies, practices and business models for local adaptation through tapping into the incredible potential of NGOs, civil society, women and young innovators. This	



initiative empowers local actors and contributes to the <u>Principles for Locally Led Adaptation</u>, which have been endorsed by UNDP and partners around the world.

The AIM has different funding windows, one of these is the AF-EU-UNDP Innovation Small Grant Aggregator Platform (ISGAP). ISGAP counts with the financial contributions from the AF (5 million USD) - anchored under their Adaptation Fund Climate Innovation Accelerator (AFCIA), and the EU (EUR 10 million). In March 2022, US \$ 2.2 million in climate action grants for 22 local innovators across 19 countries were issued, and in early 2023, additional US \$ 2 million will be given to local innovators through 20-25 new climate action grants.

ISGAP grantees benefit from knowledge management and sharing, global partnerships and investment brokering services that the Resilience Knowledge Coalition offers. The Resilience Knowledge Coalition is a "network of networks" hosted by the Global Resilience Partnership (GRP) and co-led by International Centre for Climate Change And Development (ICCCAD)/ Least developed Universities Consortium for Climate Change and Climate and Development Knowledge Network (CDKN)/ SouthSouthNorth, with the objective of getting the latest and best knowledge used in policies, plans and investments to build a resilient futures. The coalition directly aligns with the Adaptation Innovation Marketplace's innovation landscape and objectives: "Knowledge Coordination and Result Aggregation" and "Aggregated Technical Support / Investment Brokering Facility".

The AIM, through the ISGAP programme which is implemented by UNDP, focuses on providing an appropriate ecosystem that supports local communities and entrepreneurs to innovate or re-interpret the technologies or techniques needed to make their local realities more resilient to climate change, which is more critical than ever.

This year, UNDP is also partnering with the Global Resilience Partnership to highlight successes from the ground, including inviting grantees from the UNDP-implemented Adaptation Fund Climate Innovation Accelerator (AFCIA) to share their success stories.

On Friday 10 March at 6pm Dhaka-time, UNDP will co-host with the Global Resilience Partnership a session titled, 'Innovation in locally led adaptation: solutions for resilient women, youth, refugees and indigenous communities.'

The 90-minute session will present an overview of five local champions and their innovation for adaptation tools/practices and business models from the first cohort of the Adaptation Fund-UNDP Innovation Small Grant Aggregator Platform (ISGAP). The session is intended to celebrate the journey of these local partners with ISGAP, and to highlight the work that these NGOs/civil society organizations are doing to build resilient communities of women, youth, refugees, and indigenous peoples. The session will also discuss how their innovation for adaptation tools/practices and business models are being accelerated and scaled-up.
