CONTEXT

- Future effects of climate change will further intensify challenges facing LDCs -IPCC AR5.
- Response to COP 17, which recognized that sufficient progress on the remaining elements of the LDC work programme (other than NAPAs) had yet to be realized and that specific support was required to enable LDCs to participate effectively in the UNFCCC process.
- LDC negotiators' effective representation of their countries at UNFCCC processes remains hindered by insufficient technical capacity and resources.

Problems exacerbated by:

- Increase in frequency in negotiation meetings on the road to Paris
- Increasing number of topics, agenda, and financial mechanisms being negotiated
- Insufficient institutional capacity of LDCs to follow these negotiations and implement decisions

EXPECTED IMPACTS

At the end of the programme, LDCs will be better equipped to strategically engage in intergovernmental CC negotiations of current relevant work-streams such as National Adaptation Plans and upcoming financial mechanisms such as the Green Climate Fund.

Institutional sustainability of the knowledge generated will be key to ensure that COP decisions are taken up and rolled out in beneficiary countries.









PROGRAMME OUTCOMES

Capacity of LDCs to participate effectively in intergovernmental climate change processes strengthened (Outcome 1 - UNDP)

Institutional capacity of LDCs to collect, interpret and disseminate climate change data and information is strengthened (Outcome 2 – UNEP)

Knowledge generated by the project is collected and disseminated (Outcome 3 - UNDP and UNEP)





PROGRAMME EXECUTION

- Training workshops focused on enhancing negotiation skills, new workstreams, and application of climate science and information in negotiations.
- Tailored training for senior and upcoming negotiators
- E-learning modalities targeting upcoming negotiators
- Support development of long-term strategy for LDC group.
- Provide institutional support to strengthen national coordination mechanisms for CC.
- Disseminate knowledge products relevant to CC negotiations through existing networks.
